Celebrate Light and Life, Not Darkness and Death

Next week we are going to have a time change that allows us to be able to sleep an hour extra on one day of the year. It is bad enough that the days are growing shorter, but the downside Daylight Savings Time ending is that now the day descends into darkness faster. The article quoted in the bulletin offers an interesting perspective on the dread of the growing darkness and a simple solution.

The transition from fall to winter means grayer skies, shorter days, and for some people, the return of seasonal affective disorder. With the apropos acronym of SAD, this disorder has symptoms similar to depression (such as feeling sad, listless, and sluggish) but occurs only during the late fall and early winter.

Light therapy — which involves sitting close to a special light source every morning for at least 30 minutes — can help improve SAD. But many people don't realize that this therapy can also be effective for major depression and depression that occurs during or after pregnancy, known as perinatal depression.

"For both seasonal and nonseasonal depression, the effectiveness of light therapy is approximately the same as antidepressant medications, or popular forms of psychotherapy such as cognitive behavioral therapy," says Dr. Richard S. Schwartz.

Light is a major Biblical theme. The entire Bible starts off light and it ends with light.

Gen 1:1-5 In the beginning God created the heaven and the earth. 2And the earth was without form, and void; and darkness was upon the face of the deep. And the Spirit of God moved upon the face of the waters. 3And God said, Let there be light: and there was light. 4And God saw the light, that it was good: and God divided the light from the darkness. 5And God called the light Day, and the darkness he called Night. And the evening and the morning were the first day.

Yes, there was darkness and night. But which part of the day was called *good*? The light! Rev 21:23 And the city had no

need of the sun, neither of the moon, to shine in it: for the glory of God did lighten it, and the Lamb *is* the light thereof.

Darkness is a judgment from God.

We are called out of darkness and have no part with it.

2Cor 6:14 Be ye not unequally yoked together with unbelievers: for what fellowship hath righteousness? with unrighteousness? and what communion hath light with darkness?

When Paul was called to preach, he was called out of the darkness of blindness. He was sent to bring people out of the darkness and the power of Satan to life in Christ.

Acts 26:13-18 At midday, O king, I saw in the way a light from heaven, above the brightness of the sun, shining round about me and them which journeyed with me.

14And when we were all fallen to the earth, I heard a voice speaking unto me, and saying in the Hebrew tongue, Saul, Saul, why persecutest thou me? *it is* hard for thee to kick against the pricks.

15And I said, Who art thou, Lord? And he said, I am Jesus whom thou persecutest.

16But rise, and stand upon thy feet: for I have appeared unto thee for this purpose, to make thee a minister and a witness both of these things which thou hast seen, and of those things in the which I will appear unto thee; 17Delivering thee from the people, and *from* the Gentiles, unto whom now I send thee,

18To open their eyes, and to turn them from darkness to light, and from the power of Satan unto God, that they may receive forgiveness of sins, and inheritance among them which are sanctified by faith that is in me

God has called us out of darkness to be light.

1Pet 2:9 But ye *are* a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, an holy nation, a peculiar people; that ye should shew forth the praises of him who hath called you out of darkness into his marvellous light:

Eph 5:3-13 But fornication, and all uncleanness, or covetousness, let it not be once named among you, as becometh saints;

4Neither filthiness, nor foolish talking, nor jesting, which are not convenient: but rather giving of thanks.

5For this ye know, that no whoremonger, nor unclean person, nor covetous man, who is an idolater, hath any inheritance in the kingdom of Christ and of God.

6Let no man deceive you with vain words: for because of these things cometh the wrath of God upon the children of disobedience.

7Be not ye therefore partakers with them.

8For ye were sometimes darkness, but now *are ye* light in the Lord: walk as children of light:

9(For the fruit of the Spirit *is* in all goodness and righteousness and truth:)

10Proving what is acceptable

unto the Lord. 11And have no fellowship with the unfruitful works of darkness,

the unfruitful works of darkness but rather reprove *them*.

12For it is a shame even to speak of those things which are done of them in secret.

13But all things that are reproved are made manifest by the light: for whatsoever doth make manifest is light.

I know that I do not speak just for myself when I say that the favorite part of our Christmas Eve Service is not when we turn the lights down low to inspire a thoughtful and reverent frame for the service. The favorite part is when we light a candle and then pass the light on to everyone around us.

Rom 13:11-13 And that, knowing the time, that now *it is* high time to awake out of sleep: for now *is* our salvation nearer than when we believed.

12The night is far spent, the day is at hand: let us therefore cast

off the works of darkness, and let us put on the armour of light. 13Let us walk honestly, as in the day; not in rioting and drunkenness, not in chambering and wantonness, not in strife and envying.

Matt 5:14-16 Ye are the light of the world. A city that is set on an hill cannot be hid.

15Neither do men light a candle, and put it under a bushel, but on a candlestick; and it giveth light unto all that are in the house.

16Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good

works, and glorify your Father

which is in heaven.

There is a story told about a Sunday School child who was asked the question, "What is a saint?" The church where she went was very majestic with stained glass windows. They were the kind where beautiful paintings of Bible saints were depicted on the glass. The child gave the best answer she could, "Saints are people who the light shines through!" Is the light of Christ shining through you? Do others see the love of Christ shining through you? Is the light obscured by highway dirt and grime that you haven't cleaned off? Is the light of Christ obscured because of no repentance and renewal?

There is a difference between obscuring the light and being in darkness. Sometimes people joke about "Seeing the light," but that is precisely what is needed. When you ask Christ to be your Savior, you become a child of the light with the light of Christ in you. Until that moment, you are in darkness
